# **Annual Subscriptions and Finances**

We would like to remind residents that annual subscriptions become due on 1 May. Many residents will have already made payment for this financial year through the standing order which they have already set up. If you would like to set up a new standing order, please contact your Street Representative who will be pleased to provide you with a blank form.

As in previous years, our Street Representatives will shortly be delivering envelopes to the other residents who do not have a standing order in place. Donations are voluntary and whilst we do not specify a particular amount, the typical donation made is £5 per house.

## Parking

Residents would have seen from the Wilmslow Express that proposals for Traffic Regulation Orders have been published for those roads which are most affected by all day parking, being Carrwood Road and Broad Walk. The proposed restrictions are broadly in line with 'The Cheadle solution' to parking restrictions, the principles of which were discussed at our meeting at Gorsey School last May (principally comprising restrictions for part of the day only, so stopping parking for the whole of the working day).

In addition, restrictions are proposed for Pownall Road and part of Alton Road, where it is thought that these areas might see a migration of parking when restrictions are placed on Broad Walk and Carrwood Road.

Full details with maps, are available for viewing at Willmslow Library and at the Information Office at the Leisure Centre. # Field behind Gorsey School

Following the submission of nearly 100 forms of support and evidence, The Friends of Gorsey Field submitted an application for Village Green status at the end of March 2009. Objections to the application, including those from Cheshire East Education Committee and Gorsey School, were submitted in October 2009.

The application is being considered by a Cheshire East solicitor who is independent of the land owning Cheshire East Education Authority. Adjudication on the application is now awaited although no indication has been given as to how long this might take.
